

September Competition Fly by Gerda

Gerda's Spinner

I came across a fly similar to this and liked it but finding just the right materials was difficult. This is a bit of a variation from the original as the original had a distinct red rib but I couldn't find anything to make the rib.

Materials

Hook Black Magic E16

Thread 1 Red unithread 6/0 or 8/0
Thread 2 Camel unithread 6/0
Tail Brown hackle fibres

Abdomen Red Floss

Underwing Light blue congo hair

Wing Deer hair

The hardest material to find will be the light blue floss but Dave has plenty and will bring some to the August meeting where I will demonstrate the fly and to the September executive meeting.





Run the red thread to the bend of the hook.



Tie in the tail.



Tie in the red floss.



Wind the floss forward, tie off and trim.



Tie in the camel thread.



Tie off red thread and trim.



Tie in the under wing and



Stack the deer hair and tie in



Trim the deer hair then whip finish.
